CONCERNING

HUMANITARIAN SCHOLARSHIP GRANT POLICY

- Considering : a. Whereas President University is committed to upholding the values of humanity and global solidarity in the field of higher education.
- b. Whereas students originating from countries experiencing conflict face limitations in accessing higher education due to social, political, and/or economic conditions prevailing in their respective countries.
- c. Whereas in light of foregoing considerations, President University is committed to providing access and educational support to students from conflict-affected countries.
- d. Therefore, in relation to premises abovementioned, it is necessary to establish Rector's Regulation.

Article 1

General Provision

The Humanitarian Scholarship is a scholarship awarded to students from countries experiencing armed conflict, prolonged political tension, and/or humanitarian disasters.

Article 2

Purposes

This regulation aims to:

- a) Provide access to higher education for students affected by conflict;
- b) Enhance the university's contribution to humanitarian issues and educational diplomacy;

- c) Support Indonesia's role in contributing to international development; and
- d) Strengthen international cooperation in the field of higher education.

Article 3
Scholarship Granting

- (1) The Humanitarian Scholarship shall be awarded based on administrative selection and recommendation from international humanitarian organizations, the Embassy or official representation of the relevant country or partner institutions of President University.
- (2) The Humanitarian Scholarship may include a waiver of tuition fees, living allowance, housing accommodation, research project, and assistance with visa and residence permit expenses in Indonesia.

Article 4
Eligibility Requirements and Criteria for Recipients

- (1) Shall be a national of a country currently experiencing conflict as classified in the Classification of Fragile and Conflict-Affected Situations published annually by the World Bank Group.
- (2) Shall have secured admission to President University in an undergraduate or master's degree program in any major.
- (3) Shall demonstrate financial incapacity through the submission of valid and verifiable supporting documentation.
- (4) Shall possess a satisfactory academic record meeting the minimum academic eligibility requirements established by the University.
- (5) Shall be in good medical condition, as evidenced by a recent and valid medical certificate issued by a licensed medical practitioner.
- (6) Shall declare and maintain a bona fide commitment to complete the studies on time in accordance with the applicable academic regulations of the program being pursued.
- (7) Shall comply with all prevailing laws and regulations of the Republic of Indonesia.

Article 5
Duration and Reporting Obligations

- (1) The Humanitarian Scholarship shall be granted for a period of 1 (one) academic year and may be extended subject to academic performance evaluation by the University.
- (2) Recipients of the Humanitarian Scholarship shall submit a periodic academic progress report every 3 (three) months to the University using the form provided by the University.

Article 6
Scholarship Revocation

- (1) The Humanitarian Scholarship may be revoked in the event the recipient is found to have violated prevailing laws and regulations in the Republic of Indonesia and President University's internal regulations such as academic regulations or code of ethics.

- (2) The decision to revoke the Humanitarian Scholarship shall be made by the Rector based on the results of an evaluation and clarification process on the violation committed by the scholarship recipient.

Article 7
Miscellaneous

- (1) This Rector's Regulation shall enter into force as of the date of its enactment.
- (2) Any previous regulations and policies that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Rector's Regulation are hereby revoked and declared null and void.
- (3) In the event that any errors are subsequently found in this Rector's Regulation, necessary corrections shall be made accordingly.
